Dear Mr. Hofert:


The Maryland Department of the Environment has determined that the above referenced spray gun is an acceptable alternative to high-volume, low-pressure (HVLP) spray guns for all VOC coating processes regulated under COMAR 26.11.19. This determination is based on the review of the documents you provided from US EPA and the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) dated July 20, 2011 and September 8, 2011 respectively regarding these spray guns.

This approval is subject to the following conditions:

1. Each TEKNA Pro and ProLite spray gun shall be supplied with a mounted pressure gauge clearing identifying the maximum allowable inlet air pressure as identified in your letter, and a gun mounted air pressure regulating device.
2. Each TEKNA Pro and ProLite spray gun shall be supplied with written notification that:
  - a. The maximum air pressure supplied to the spray gun shall not exceed the described psi, and
  - b. The gun mounted pressure gauge and air pressure regulating device must be attached to the spray gun and be in good working condition whenever the spray gun is in use.
